

Adventist ACE— preparing our young people for the future through providing quality faith-based college courses now

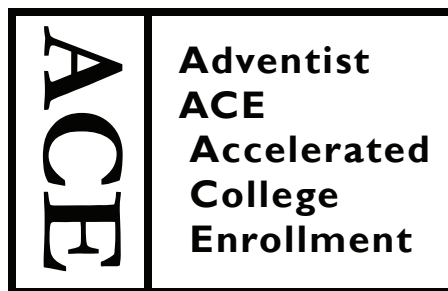

Adventist ACE provides faith-based dual enrollment through online learning

High school juniors and seniors are signing up for college courses at local colleges across the nation in ever increasing numbers. Chances are that some high school students in your area have either have taken or will take dual enrollment courses.

But where will be the integration of faith and learning in these courses?

Adventist ACE—Accelerated College Enrollment—is here to bring a quality dual enrollment program through on-line learning to students who desire to take faith-based, Adventist college level courses while continuing their education at their local day academy, boarding academy, public school, or home school.

Who is Eligible?

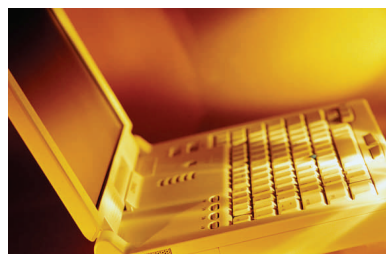
Students entering their junior year of high school with a GPA of 3.5 or higher, and students entering their senior year of high school with a GPA of 3.0 or higher are eligible to enroll in ACE courses.

How do Students Sign Up?

- 1) Submit the application form found at <http://www.Adventistedu.org/ACE>.
- 2) Submit transcripts, letter of permission from parents, and a recommendation from the academy/high school (either guidance counselor or principal) to ACE Coordinator (ACE@Adventistedu.org)

What Courses are Available?

Course schedules and offerings are varied. Visit the Adventist Digital Education Consortium (ADEC) website (<http://www.sdaedu.org>) for current offerings or visit participating institutions' websites. Qualified ACE students are may enroll in 100- and 200-level courses.

How do Students Receive High School Credit?

Students may be able to receive credit through their local Adventist academy. Registrars can contact the ACE coordinator (ACE@Adventistedu.org) for more information. Alternately, students may receive credit through our affiliated academies and can transfer those credit hours.
